Standards of Advanced Primary Care were developed over 18+ months by the **CQC Steering Committee**.



Purchaser Use of the Advanced Primary Care Measures



Recognizes importance of **patient outcomes and experience of care**. Deemphasizes process-orientated and burdensome approaches (e.g., PCMH) to identify effective primary care.



Assesses the entire spectrum of primary care, including **pediatric** and **adult** measures.



Aligned around a suite of quality domains representing high quality and value of care.



Demonstrates equitable care and health through race and ethnicity stratification.



Identifies small and large **practices providing advanced primary care** and concentration and variation within contracted health plan networks.



Leverages <u>existing data infrastructure</u> through alignment of measures in use across payers and national and regional quality programs.
